THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY, B

THEME: The Poor Know How to Share

For some it is something surprising and heart-warming to see how many poor people help one another, how they share the very little they have and do so without much ado, discreetly and spontaneously. Should that not be to all of us an invitation to conversion, to greater generosity? It makes the poor person a benefactor, the receiver into a

giver, the destitute into a rich person. Where do we stand? Do we know to give with trust in both God and people? Let us join Christ in his sacrifice, in the Eucharist and in life, for he gave himself totally.

MEDITATE: This passage from Mark offers stark contrasts between the way people give.

ACT: Take time to examine your charitable contributions and where and how you give of your time, talent and treasure.

NOVEMBER 10th: ST. LEO THE GREAT


Pope Leo, one of three Popes history calls "great". A great administrator, conciliator and preacher. In 451, he called the Council of Chalcedon which defined the two natures in Christ. He spoke of the Pope as a successor of Peter and not of an immediate predecessor. Many of his doctrinal teachings are very modern. He especially emphasized the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and the presence of the Lord in our daily lives.

NOVEMBER 12th: ST. JOSAPHAT

Josaphat spent many of the 43 years of his life working for Christian unity. He is often called the "Apostle of Union". His untimely death, in 1623, was brought about by those who opposed his efforts to bring together Lithuanian and Rutherian Christians [Polish/Russian Christians].
