### **THEME: Do We Go Jesus' Way?**


What are we looking for in life? Good health, happiness in our families, in our job, in our faith, good relationships with ourselves, with people and with God. When Jesus tells us that we have to follow him in taking up the crosses that come our way, do we accept that as disciples of Jesus today? Do we take that as a part of our faith or do we say: "Lord, everything - but not that!"? Jesus assures us: "Anyone who loses his/her life for my sake will find life, will save life." Let us then meet the Lord who speaks to us.



**MEDITATE:** This passage in Mark's Gospel marks an important turning point. Jesus is on the road to Jerusalem, to the cross and suffering. Ultimately it will lead to his death and Resurrection.

**ACT:** Instead of asking God to ease your burdens, pray to him in thanksgiving that he gives you renewed strength to face the challenges that are set in your path.

### **SEPTEMBER 13<sup>th</sup>: SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM**


 Named after the Apostle John, lived an austere life, striving to reform the morals of the clergy and people. He was not much of a team player and not very popular, and ended his life in exile.

### **SEPTEMBER 14<sup>th</sup>: TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS**

The cross means different things to different people. It signifies inhumanity, the humanity of God, the value of suffering, God's love, Jesus' obedience, victory, forgiveness, sacrifice and life from death. We bring our own emotions, memories and life experiences to the cross. Just as Jesus gave us life from His crucified death, so He fills whatever we bring to the cross with the power of Easter.



### **SEPTEMBER 15<sup>th</sup>: OUR LADY OF SORROWS**

 What sustained Mary was faith that God is true to His word. She stood on His word to her. In the same way, we can endure anything if we know that someone cares and that God is achieving something valuable through us. In dark times, faith enables us to hold to the promise.

### **NEW MASS SCHEDULE**

As all Masses are now public, it is important that we continue to ensure that the Church remains a safe place where people gather to worship. The overriding principles continue to be that we need to maintain preventative practices to stop the spread of the disease: these include taking account of the prevailing local conditions, continuing to use sanitisers and wearing face masks [unless you are unable to do so for medical reasons], general cleaning to a good standard [with attention to frequent touchpoints], maintaining 1metre+ separation, good ventilation [**doors will remain open during Mass and the heating has to remain off**], registration of track and trace details [**we are still obliged to keep record of people attending**], and continuation of stewards at Mass.
