### **THEME: Where do we stand?**

Today, on this Palm Sunday, and during the days of Holy Week we look at Jesus with the people who saw him acclaimed with the palms they were waving, carrying his cross, and dying a shameful death on the cross. Where do we stand? With whom do we identify? To us is he really the Son of God who died for us because he loved us? How different is our life because we know him? And next Sunday will we rejoice and acclaim him as our Lord who gives us life?

Your co-operation will be greatly appreciated and will help prevent disappointment to others.

The Palms will be blessed and distributed at the end of Mass. **READINGS:** 1<sup>st</sup>: Isaiah 50. 4-7; Psalm 21; 2<sup>nd</sup>: Philippians 2.6-11; Gospel: Mark 14.1-15.47. **Intention:** People of the Parish.

**GOOD FRIDAY: 2<sup>nd</sup> April: A day of Fasting and Abstinence.**

**10.30am:Public:** Passion [St. John] – Stations – Veneration - Communion

**3.00pm: Public:** Celebration of the Lord's Passion:

1<sup>st</sup> Part: **Readings:** 1<sup>st</sup>. Isaiah 52.13-53.12; Psalm 30; 2<sup>nd</sup>. Hebrews 4.14-16, 5.7-9; Gospel: the Passion according to John:18.1-19.42.

**Solemn Intercessions:** The Holy Father has decreed that a special intention (For the afflicted in time of Pandemic) be inserted before the intercession For those in Tribulation (X).

IX b. For the afflicted in time of pandemic

Let us pray also for all those who suffer the consequences of the current pandemic, that God the Father may grant health to the sick, strength to those who care for them, comfort to families and salvation to all the victims who have died.

Prayer in silence. Then the Priest says:

Almighty ever-living God, only support of our human weakness, look with compassion upon the sorrowful condition of your children who suffer because of this pandemic; relieve the pain of the sick, give strength to those who care for them, welcome into your peace those who have died and, throughout this time of tribulation, grant that we may all find comfort in your merciful love. **EASTER VIGIL: 3<sup>rd</sup> April: 7.30pm: Public.** The preparation of the fire is omitted and the Paschal Candle is lit without ceremony and procession. The Easter proclamation immediately follows.

The Liturgy of the Word follows, noting the requirements of the readings, psalms and prayers. 1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Genesis 1.1 – 2.2; Psalm 103. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Exodus 14.15-15.1; Response: Exodus 15; 3<sup>rd</sup> Reading: Ezekiel 36. 16-28; Psalm 41; 4<sup>th</sup> Reading: Romans 6.3-11; Psalm 117; Gospel: Matthew 28. 1-10

The Renewal of Baptismal Promises is made without the blessing of water. The Mass continues with the Liturgy of the Eucharist. **Intention:** People of the Parish.
