THEME: What Brings Us Happiness That Lasts?



We all need the things that are necessary for life, but our human experience keeps reminding us again and again of what Jesus tells us in the gospel: accumulating riches does not bring happiness! The joy of living does not depend on full granaries or fat bank accounts. The quality of life and its joy depend rather on how much we love the Lord and one another and on how far we can share what we have. That is how we become rich in the sight of God. This week we ask our Lord that he bring us joy and happiness along with this friendship.

MEDITATE: The rich man in Jesus' parable believed that his overly abundant crops would buy his future security. In the end they provided nothing. His security was misplaced.

ACT: Spend time this week praying that the obstacles to your relationship with God be removed. Take action to rectify this.

Pause for Thought: *Jesus was rich in many ways but chose to be with us in our needs, so that his poverty might enrich us.*

please repair in me what is weary or broken
and revive my drooping spirit.

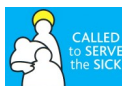
