We remember Mary during May



The month of May is set aside by the Church for special devotion in honour of Mary, the Mother of God and our Mother. During the month of May we can create a "May Altar" in honour of Mary. Place a statue or picture of Our Lady. A blue or white cloth is usually laid on the altar as these are the colours we think of when we think of Mary. As May is the first month of summer, fresh flowers and plants are usually used to decorate the altar. A candle [lit safely] and rosary beads can be placed on the altar and you could say a decade of the Rosary every day during the month of May.

Pope Francis is encouraging everyone to rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home within the family, in the month of May especially during this time of pandemic. Mary's Meals Pray in May Campaign

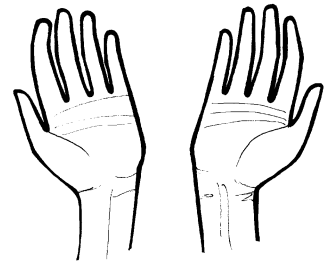

the praise of the loveliest flower of the vale.

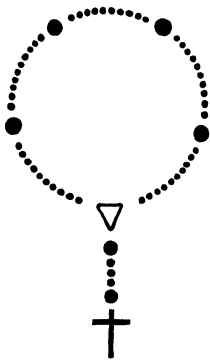
*O Mary we crown thee with blossoms today,

The Rosary



People have been praying the Rosary since the days of St. Dominic in the thirteenth century. Pilgrims would pray the Rosary as they walked between holy places, moving the beads in time with their footsteps whilst thinking about Jesus life, death and resurrection. In 2002 Pope John Paul II added The Mysteries of Light to the Rosary.

The days for each set of mysteries are:

The Joyful Mysteries to be prayed on Mondays and Saturdays

The Sorrowful Mysteries to be prayed on Tuesdays and Fridays

The Glorious Mysteries to be prayed on Wednesdays and Sundays

The Mysteries of Light to be prayed on Thursdays

The “Memorare”

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help or sought thy intercession was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, I fly unto thee. O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee I come, before thee I stand sinful and sorrowful.
